

Jewish-Christian Dialogue To Begin Its Third Year

The Jewish-Christian Dialogue begins its third year in Mobile Sunday, October 16 at 7:30 p.m. at the Springhill Ave. Temple. This year promised to be even more exciting and rewarding than the previous two years. Plans have been finalized for the 1977-78 series of dialogues which will consist of six sessions.

The purpose of the "Dialogue" is to provide a climate in which Jews & Christians can come to know one another on a personal level and to share with one

another their respective beliefs, their common fears and hopes for the future.

During the prior two years, the forum was "Desert and Dialogue". Jews and Christians met together in small groups of 10-16 people in private homes and discussed such subjects as: "Anti-Semitism", "Persecution of Christians," "Original Sin," "Abortion", "Concepts of God" and other topics of mutual interest to both groups. The new season offers a new and different format for Dialogue. Each of

the six sessions planned will feature a specific topic. There will be time allotted for questions following each presentation after which the actual "Dialogue" will ensue in small groups of 8-10 people.
