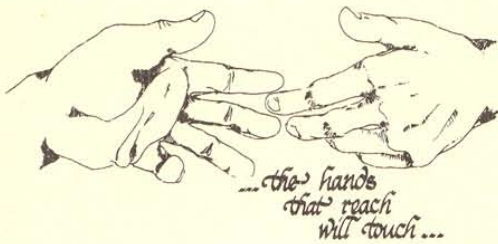

For the past six years the MOBILE AREA JEWISH CHRISTIAN DIALOGUE group has been meeting in an attempt to achieve understanding and tolerance of each of our individual faiths. It came into being because a few members of the Roman Catholic Community had a strong commitment to begin building bridges between the two communities.

The first 2 years small groups of Catholics & Jews met in private homes to get acquainted, build trust and discuss topics of mutual interest. During the second year we were fortunate to have several members of the Protestant community join us; hence, we became known as "THE MOBILE AREA JEWISH CHRISTIAN DIALOGUE."

As a result of the input from dialogue participants, the third year assumed a new look. A series of speakers with expertise in various areas of Christian and Jewish Theology were invited. Since both formats were so well accepted, it was decided that, during the fourth year, we would combine them and have speaker sessions as well as small group discussions.

Our fifth year, a Study Group was added to the available options for dialoguers, which consisted of educational programs at several churches in the area as well as the Dauphin St. Synagogue.

Last year, the Dialogue addressed itself primarily to one major subject area - Israel. This was an attempt to seek understanding of some important facts of history, of politics, and of our respective faiths; and even more importantly to understand why so many find in one small place, a "holy land" a "holy city" and to know why it is holy to these people of different faiths.

Dialogue is a way of actualizing God's commands toward a new "halakha" as well as an historical search for the God Who is One for us all.
