## Staring Genocide in the Face

Dear Friends,

The Christian-Jewish Dialogue is proud to present **Mr. Jerry Fowler, Staff Director of the Committee on Conscience at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.** The Committee's mandate is to "alert the national conscience, influence policymakers, and stimulate worldwide action to confront and work to halt act of genocide or related crimes against humanity." Special attention is currently being paid to the urgent crisis in the Darfur region of Sudan. In July 2004, the Committee declared a "Genocide Emergency" for Darfur, the first time in its history that it used this highest level of alert.

You are invited to join us at the Marian Center at St. Ignatius Church on March 1 to hear Jerry Fowler's first hand report following his visit to Chad and Sudan. Mr. Fowler was legislative counsel for the Lawyers Committee For Human Rights. His publications include the essay "Out of Darkness: Preventing Genocide in the 21st Century.:" He taught at George Mason University law School and George Washington University Law School and has been a Scholar-in-Residence at American University's Summer Human Rights Institute. Teachers, parents, students are especially invited to attend this important lecture. As always, the members of the Dialogue are encouraged to be with us during this, the thirtieth year of dialogue in our area. Be there to demonstrate to those teachers, parents and students that YOU value this effort and YOU have grave concerns about the ongoing genocides in our world today.
